Loyce Lane Dies, Rites Wednesday

Mrs. Loyce Lane, 75, of 716 North Birch, died Sunday morning in Ponca City Hospital where she had been admitted Thursday. She had been in ill health for three years.

She was born Dec. 21, 1896 in Oskaloosa, Iowa. Prior to coming to Ponca City in 1907, she had resided in Colorado. She was married to Ausie A. Lane, who preceded her in death Dec. 17, 1961.

Mrs. Lane was a member of First Christian Church and had been active in the Gold Star Mothers.

Survivors include one daughter, Mrs. Bob (Mary Kathryn) Campbell, Scott City, Kan.; one sister, Mrs. Oma Moncravie, 218 ½ North Fourth; three grandchildren, one great grandchild and one cousin.

Funeral service will be 11 a.m. Wednesday in the E. M. Trout and Sons Funeral chapel with the Rev. Bill Masters officiating. Burial will be in Odd Fellows Cemetery.

The casket will not be opened.

The family will be at the Moncravie residence on North Fourth.
