C. B. Warner Dies Monday Evening

C. B. Warner, 81, a long time resident of Kay county, whose farm is located near the Newkirk Country club southeast of here died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Cecil Wiggins at Ponca City Monday evening after an illness which had lasted but a short time.

The body was shipped to Humansville, Mo., Wednesday evening for burial beside that of his wife. The Gill Funeral Home at Ponca City is in charge. The deceased had been staying at his daughter's home for the past month.

In addition to Mrs. Wiggins he is survived by another daughter, Miss Emma Warner of Newkirk and a son, W. B. Warner of Denver, Colo., by a sister, Mrs. L. B. Lozar of Stockton, Mo., and by two grand children, Warner and Betty Lou Wiggins of Ponca City.

The deceased had lived with his daughter, Emma, whose devotion and care for him was beautiful to behold. He died while visiting at his other daughter at Ponca City.
