

Jacob E. Patterson was born 18 Apr 1864 in Tuscarawas Co., OH and died 9 Feb 1941 in Coffeyville, KS. His parents were John S. Patterson (b 1813 OH d 1899 Mildred, Allen, KS) and 3rd wife Jamima Teeple (b 1834 in Tuscarawas Co., OH to Jacob Teeple and Sophia Guest; Jamima died 1891 KS). The first two wives of John S. Patterson were Sarah Keeseey and Leah Gable. Between the three women, John S. Patterson sired 22 children we know about.

Anna C. Lowe's parents were Willard Lowe (1839 IN -1927 KS) and Mary Gambrel (1839 Hamilton Co., OH -1912 Allen Co., KS). Anna C. Lowe was born 20 Sep 1867 while her family lived briefly in ILL. Anna died at the home of her daughter Beulah M. Patterson Hazen 27 Dec 1955 in Ponca City, Kay, OK and is possibly buried in Coffeyville, KS.

The Lowe family has a lively and interesting history which can be traced to some of the earliest Dutch inhabitants of New Amsterdam (present day New York) through Jan-Bastiaensen Van Kortryk/Courtright born in 1618 in Leedham, Gelderland, South Holland, Netherlands and died in 1678 in New Amsterdam (New York).

Notes for Jan-Bastiansen Van Kortryk:

"Jan Bastiansen embarked with his brother, Michiel, and their respective families 16 April 1663 in the ship "DeBonte Koe" (the Spotted Cow or some say it more precisely translates to the Dappled Cow), Jan Bergen, master. Each adult was charged 39 florins, children under ten, except infants, half price. It cost Jan Bastiansen for the transportation of himself, his wife and children, 204 florins, 10 stivers. Jan had settled in Beest, a town near Leerdam. He may have been the "Kortryck" who owned a bouwery on Staten Island in 1674. He spent part of his time

at Harlem, but is last mentioned there 8 January 1677 when he was a witness to a power of attorney given his old friend, Jan Louwe Bogert to Hendrick Jansen Baker, to collect money due on Brooklyn property sold to Thomas Lamberts."

Beulah Mae Patterson was born 21 July 1894 in Iola, Allen, KS. She is the daughter of Jacob Eugene Patterson and Anna Cordelia Lowe.

Burial Note:

"Jake Patterson purchased Lot 113 for Ruby Pearl Patterson (12 years of age) and Lot 114 for Glen Patterson. Ruby's marker bears the inscription 'Daughter of J. E. and Anna Patterson'; she was buried November 19, 1909. Glen Patterson was buried February 13, 1920."

Glen Fay Patterson was the son of Jacob Eugene Patterson and Cordellia Ann "Anna" Lowe. Glen was single. He became ill on 27 Jan 1920 with influinza and pneumonia, and died a little more than two weeks later and is buried next to his sister Ruby.
